

Chemical Immobilization and Animal Capture Techniques

During this class officers/students will learn the correct way to tranquilize an animal and how to safely capture animals without use of tranquilization; the two skills that will become part of their every day duties. After this class they should be able to safely and confidently bring any Animal under control for safety of people around it and its own safety.

The proper use of this equipment is very essential to an Officer and very important to the Agency it is employed by. Classes last from one day to one and half days depending on the group.
